Lord of all creation *All:* Help us look after your wonderful world.




Finger 2 – Those who point the way

We pray for the Church throughout the world: that it may be a place of giving, of love and of peace.

<u>Finger 4 – The ring finger, those who are weak, in trouble or pain</u>

We pray for all people who are sad, lonely, frightened, sick or troubled: that God may give them hope.

Finger 5 – Prayers for me

Pope Francis says that when we have prayed for other people, we can ask God for our own needs.

Spend a few moments quietly praying to God.
