KING ASA 911-870 BCE


Asa reformed religion in Judah, returning to the Lord. He repaired the Temple and tackled the problem of idolatry. But he plotted against the Kingdom of Israel.

KING HEZEKIAH 728-687 BCE

He restored worship at the Lord's Temple in Jerusalem and restarted the festival of Passover. He also rebelled against Assyria with the help of Egypt.



KING JOSIAH

641-609 BCE

A version of Deuteronomy was discovered in the Temple, so Josiah used it to turn people back to God. Many prophets like Jeremiah, Baruch, Habakkuk, and Zephaniah lived whilst he was King. He died fighting the Egyptian army.
